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The Blueprint for Water coalition supports Defra's aspiration for a Catchment Based Approach to freshwater management and conservation in the UK, announced today by Richard Benyon MP, Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for Natural Environment, Water and Rural Affairs.

The Blueprint for Water believes today's announcement is the first step towards a historical moment for UK freshwater conservation. But this is only the start and it is now essential that the detail surrounding the Catchment Based Approach be agreed and the delivery frameworks be put in place, if this approach is to be fit to deliver the ambitious second cycle of River Basin Management Plans that we need.
