

Wildlife and Countryside Link statement: Budget 2012

For immediate release: Wednesday 21 March 2012

Commenting on today's Budget statement, Dr Elaine King, Director of Wildlife and Countryside Link said:

"It is worrying that the Chancellor persists in wrongly casting our natural environment as a barrier to growth and prosperity. Claims that vital environmental protections stifle good development are groundless.¹

"The Budget's description of planning reforms suggest that the Government will focus on economic growth at the cost of genuinely sustainable development. The Government still has the chance to ensure its new reduced planning rules will properly protect our wildlife and countryside, not put it all up for grabs.

"Last October, our Nature Check report showed the Government had rapidly lost ground in its claims to be the 'greenest Government ever'. We want to help the Government repair its reputation but that has to start with proper restoration of our natural environment and not treating it as an endless resource."
