There'll also be opportunities to learn about potential careers in the natural environment, and (should you wish to) connect with the other young people working in New to Nature roles across the country.

This is a unique opportunity to try something new, and to take a first step on a career path where you can make a real difference. The natural environment needs you!


We also have a core aim to help deliver a more diverse and representative nature sector, working with partners on a major <u>5 year project</u> to increase the ethnic diversity of the sector.

ROLE DESCRIPTION

We're offering an exciting trainee position working on a major project to support and influence Government to deliver on its nature recovery targets. This is a development role, so enthusiasm and interest in nature and Government policy is much more important than previous experience.

It involves working as part of a small, friendly team at Wildlife and Countryside Link, the biggest environmental coalition in England. You'll also have the chance to work with colleagues from CEOs to nature experts across big organisations like National Trust and RSPB, through to specialist organisations like Plantlife and Whale and Dolphin Conservation, alongside working with MPs and Government officials.

You'll work with experts in nature policy, research and political engagement, to support you to develop your skills and experience in these areas. You'll then get to focus on your main area of interest for a further 6 months, being supported to deliver your own work on nature's recovery.

The successful candidate will gain experience in influencing for the benefit of nature, including:

- being part of a team working to influence Government policy around nature recovery
- working with MPs and officials to secure their support on policy
- strengthening creative thinking, research, presentation and leadership skills
- developing collaborative working practices and a strong network of contacts









SUPPORT AND TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

This placement is part of a national programme - New to Nature - funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund. This will include additional elements of training and personal development support provided by Groundwork UK and partners, as well as on the job training and support from Wildlife and Countryside Link.

Each young person will complete an in-depth induction programme with input from The Prince's Trust, along with tailored advice and guidance from a Groundwork Youth Employment Coach at key points during the placement. This may include identifying skills and training opportunities or help with your CV and job search skills.

Wildlife and Countryside Link will also be providing support for participants, including: a shadowing programme, a mentor, and training on parliamentary and stakeholder engagement, policy development, research design, and internal communications.

All young people on the New to Nature programme, will be invited to participate in a learning Network. This will create opportunities to take part in different talks, workshops and discussions focused on the environment sector, hosted by Groundwork and our partners.
