# Marine and Coastal Access Bill Amendment

### Advice and guidance by conservation bodies: MPA network objective (Clause 123)

The organisations listed above are all members of Wildlife and Countryside Link's Marine Task Force<sup>1</sup>, which has been campaigning for several years for improvements in marine conservation and better management of the marine area. We have been closely engaged in the Marine & Coastal Access Bill process from the outset.

#### Background

We have included a minor amendment to this clause adding in a new subclause (f) specifying that the statutory conservation body could also provide advice and guidance on how objectives for the MPA network as a whole (as defined in clause 119) might be affected under any circumstances.
